

**CIDER SOURCES:  
A BIBLIOGRAPHY OF  
TRADITIONAL ORCHARDING AND  
CIDERMAKING TEXTS, BASED ON THE  
COLLECTION OF THE  
MUSEUM OF CIDER, HEREFORD**

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## Introduction

The origin of this bibliography lies in research carried out to help establish the Museum of Cider in Hereford. A team of researchers was employed under a Manpower Services Commission scheme to make a search for published material on orcharding and cidermaking.

This bibliography is a selection of 473 of these sources. It contains all the standard British references, together with a significant number of French publications and a few from other countries, including the U.S.A. It also includes a fairly full list of the articles on orcharding and cidermaking that have appeared in the major journals since 1800.

General books on agriculture or folklore have only been included if they contain substantial sections relating to cider, orchards or related topics. Derivative pieces have also generally been excluded, but magazine articles have been listed if the author is describing his own experience. Specialist and technical articles describing modern research have generally also been excluded.

Our thanks go to all those who have helped to compile this list, especially the Bath & West and Southern Counties Society, the staff of the Long Ashton Research Station, Bristol and of the Museum of English Rural Life at Reading, all the local studies librarians who found and checked material, and of course to the team of MSC-funded researchers whose efforts made this list possible. Special thanks are due to Pauline Dabbs, Anne Godfrey and Cindy Fitzgerald for their help in checking references.

The author would appreciate notification of omissions and errors.

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## Listing scheme

Each entry in the bibliography is arranged in the form:

author (year of publication) work title publication details {Museum of Cider catalogue reference} [Note]

For completeness, a small number of entries have been included which derive from sources other than the Museum of Cider. These are marked by {NIC}. It has not always proved possible to check these additional references against the original publications.

To reduce the number of Anon entries, in cases where the author or editor is not known the entry has been listed under the publication or publisher if that is possible.

The letter c after a year of publication means the date is approximate; n.d. means no date is known.
